

The Campus Learn to Skate Program Expectations

First Day of Class

Prior to the first class, all registered families will receive a welcome email with important information for the upcoming Campus Learn to Skate Program session.

On the first day, skaters should arrive 15-30 minutes early to check in at the registration desk in The Campus lobby. At check-in, skaters will receive their class color and name tag. Name tags should be placed on the front of the skater's helmet and remain there for the entire session.

Classes are color-coded and organized into two groups:

Group 1: Lesson first, practice second

Group 2: Practice first, lesson second

Class Structure

Each session runs for 6 - 8 weeks. During this time, skaters remain in their selected level to build and strengthen the required skills.

At the final class, skaters are evaluated on their progress and are given a report card indicating whether they should move up to the next level for the next session or repeat the current level for further skill development.

Parents and skaters are encouraged to help manage their progression through the Learn to Skate curriculum. If you have any questions about levels or advancement, please reach out to Coach Freya.

Gear

All beginner level skaters are required to wear a helmet. Families must supply their own helmet. Skate rental is available and included in the cost of Learn to Skate.
